

The Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto invites applications for a tenure-stream position in the area of Canadian Politics. The appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor and will commence July 1, 2015.

Applicants must have a Ph.D. at the time of appointment or shortly thereafter in Political Science and be able to demonstrate evidence of excellence in research and teaching. The ideal candidate is someone whose work focuses on theoretical and empirical issues of Canadian Politics. We especially welcome applications from those whose research promises to contribute broadly to advancing the field of Canadian politics in theory or methods or both.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

We also seek a colleague who can communicate effectively as an undergraduate and graduate teacher. The successful candidate will contribute to the undergraduate programs in Political Science offered by the Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto. He or she will also be a member of the tri-campus Graduate Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto and will be expected to teach in its graduate programs and to supervise graduate students.

The Department of Political Science is a leading research-intensive department, with large undergraduate and graduate programs that bring together faculty from across the University of Toronto, including the Cities Centre, the Munk School of Global Affairs, and the School of Public Policy and Governance.
