

The Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto invites applications for a full-time tenure-stream position in Political Theory. The appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor and will commence July 1, 2016.

We are looking for a candidate with strong research and teaching interests in comparative political theory but who is also able to teach courses on the traditional Western canon. The position comes with undergraduate and graduate teaching responsibilities on the University's downtown (St. George) campus. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Applicants must have a Ph.D. at the time of appointment or shortly thereafter. Candidates must provide strong evidence of research of an internationally competitive calibre, as evidenced by publication in leading journals in the field, presentations at significant conferences, accolades or awards, and strong endorsements by referees. Evidence of excellence in teaching is demonstrated by a strong statement of teaching philosophy, teaching accomplishments, and endorsements from referees.
