WHY BECOME A MENTOR?

The Political Science Senior Mentorship Program was developed to enhance the student experience for 3rd and 4th year Political Science undergraduate students. By matching students with Political Science alumni, the program provides students with valuable career advice at a critical point in their education.

Students are looking for advice on the present day workplace, and are interested in hearing about your career path. They would like to broaden their horizons by learning about what career options are available to them, what current job market trends you might foresee, and how they should network. Above all, they want the sort of practical, "been-there-done-that" advice that someone with your experience can provide.

It also provides you, the mentor, with an opportunity to connect with current students and contribute to your alma matter in a meaningful way. If matched, both parties meet on a regular basis and have contact through email, phone or in-person meetings. The duration of mentoring is from October to May but can continue after the program has concluded. Alumni who have served as mentors in similar programs report that they often learn as much from the students as the students learn from them.

AS A PARTICIPATING MENTOR, WE ASK THAT YOU COMMIT TO:

- We recommend meeting at least three times during the academic year (October until March) with the student we match you with either in-person, by phone or by email, as agreed upon between you and your student.
- Attend the opening reception with all mentors and students. Details TBA.
- Completion of a brief evaluation at the conclusion of the program.
